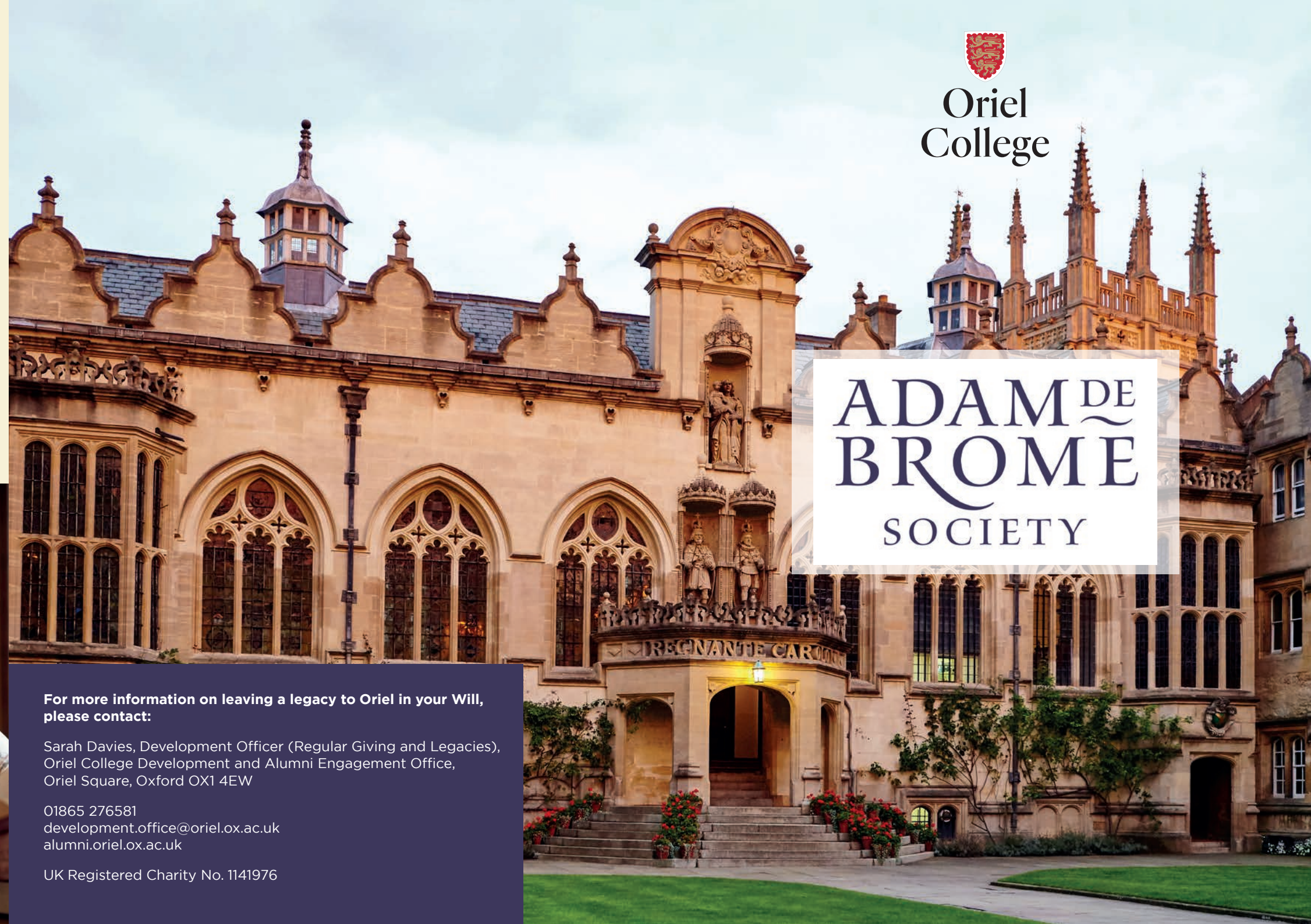

Your Legacy

We welcome all types of legacy gifts. Some benefactors choose to give a percentage of their estate. Others choose to give a specific amount, or specify an item to be given to the College.

For advice on wording, we recommend you consult your solicitor, but the below may be a useful example:

I leave to Oriel College (UK Registered Charity No. 1141976) [all/a percentage] of the residue of my estate for its general purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Provost or other authorised officer shall be a good and sufficient discharge to my Executors or Trustees for the discharge of the said legacy.

Whilst we cannot advise on the legal content of a Will, do please get in touch to discuss your intentions for your gift so we can work with you to plan its impact.
